

Road Etiquette for Cyclists :



- ✓ Wear a helmet (and any other safety gear).
- ✓ Stay on the right side of the road.
- ✓ Stay in a single file line.
- ✓ Only park your car/bike in areas where it does not obstruct traffic or businesses.

Road Etiquette for Vehicles :



- ✓ Reduce speed when approaching cyclists, especially on narrow roads.
- ✓ Yield to cyclists at intersections.
- ✓ Avoid cutting off cyclists when turning or merging.
- ✓ Never drive in designated bike lanes unless turning.

Parking:

- No Parking on Private Property (Includes community spaces) – Do not park in front of private driveways, or businesses. Blocking access roads is strictly prohibited.
- Respect Local Residents – Be mindful of property owners and avoid causing disruptions.
- Roadside Parking – Allowed if your vehicle does not obstruct traffic or violate posted restrictions.

Vehicle and Parking Regulations:

- Section 76(2): Vehicles can be parked for no more than 72 hours at a time on a highway.
- Section 77(1): Vehicles must not park in a manner that obstructs/ impedes traffic flow (including driveways, private property access).
- Section 77(1): Parked Vehicles that violate the bylaw or regulations may be towed and impounded

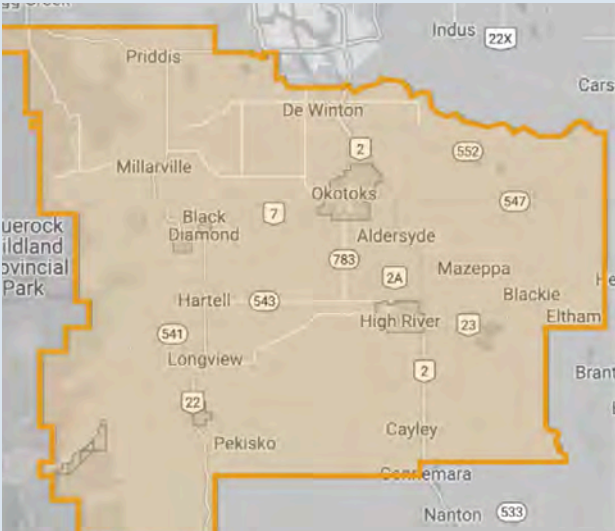

- Some roads in the area have limited shoulders, ride cautiously.
- Wildlife is common, be aware of deer and other animals.
- Weather can change quickly, be prepared for wind, rain, or sudden temperature drops.

Traffic Safety Act

Cyclists' Responsibilities:

- Bicycles are considered vehicles under Alberta law, meaning cyclists must obey all traffic laws applicable to motor vehicles.
- Section 77(2): Cyclists must ride as far to the right as practicable when on highways.
- Section 11: Cyclist's must use proper hand signals when turning or stopping.
- Section 113(1) and 113(2): Night riding requires a front light, a rear red light, a rear red reflector and brakes.
- Section 111 and 112: Cyclist 18 years or under must wear a safety helmet.
