
## ANIMALS IN THE M.D. OF FOOTHILLS



## **LAND USE BYLAW REGULATIONS**

The Land Use Bylaw permits one (1) animal unit per three (3) acres of land, with the exception of three (3) animal units per lot on lots between three (3) and nine (9) acres in size.

To increase those animals as noted above, you must first determine weather you would fall under the new Provincial Guidelines for Confined Feeding Operations by Contacting Kai Ma at the NRCB (403) 381-5112. If you do not fall under the CFO guidelines, a Development Permit application for an Intensive Livestock Operation is required to be made through the M.D. of Foothills. Please see Form 2 for application requirements.
