What happened in the last two weeks?

- An impaired driver was taken off the road with an IRS suspension on Highway 2 on January 25th, 2023 resulting from a public complaint of erratic driving. Vehicle was also seized.
- An impaired driver was taken off the road with an IRS Suspension near Diamond Valley (formerly Black Diamond) on February 1, 2023 as a result of a member of the public report a suspected intoxicated person who drove into the ditch. Vehicle was also seized.
- A fraud involving someone posing as a bank representative over the phone.
- Be vigilant of a scam which is affecting farmers who are hiring a fraudulent company to transport hay. If you don't know the company please verify.
- There has been two break and enters in the eastern portion of Foothills County.

Collisions

There have been an abundance of deer collisions in Foothills County this year which brings up the question "when to report a collision".

The general rule of thumb is this, the collision is:

- 1. Fatal or major injury
- 2. Hit and run
- 3. Damage over \$2000.00
 - a. If two or more vehicles, it is combined damage over \$2000.00

If your car is driveable and information has been exchanged in a property damage only collision, you may attend the detachment to report. You do not need to call police.

Things to bring when you attend to report

- Driver license, registration and insurance of vehicle involved in the collision
- 2 good photos of the damage, a photo of the door VIN number and a photo of the rear license plate.

The driver of the vehicle has to make the statement.


Report the collision asap, within 2 weeks. A file number and damage sticker may not be issued after this time.

Any collision which happened in Alberta outside of a major center can be reported at your nearest RCMP Detachment. **If the collision happened in Calgary, the collision must be reported in Calgary**
