Additionally, with the warmer weather arriving, so too does the increase of motorcycles on the roadways as well as cyclists. Both motorcycles and cyclists are harder to spot than larger average vehicles that drivers may be more readily aware of. RCMP want to remind both cyclists and other motorists to respect each other and the rules of the road to keep everyone safe.

Did you know? Your vehicle license plate **belongs to you, the registered owner, not** the vehicle it is registered to. This is important to know when you are buying or selling a vehicle as you will need to remove your license plate before the new owner takes possession of the vehicle.

If you find you have had a license plate lost or stolen off of a vehicle, trailer, etc., Alberta Registries requires you to report this to the police agency where it has been lost/stolen and provide them a file number before it can be taken out of your name. When reporting to a police agency, please ensure you know the plate number that has gone missing and if possible, provide the previous registration associated to that plate.
