Disappearing Grasslands

Grasslands are found all around the world and are exactly what you think they are; land that is mostly covered in grass. Alberta's grasslands fall within the North American Grasslands or Great plains. This extends from Mexico through the United States into Alberta and Saskatchewan. Canadian native grasslands are approximately ¼ of their original size and rapidly declining. Calls for conservation are increasing, as native grasslands are the most at-risk and the least protected ecosystems globally. Within the Alberta grasslands, they have uses as pasture, aiding in carbon sequestration and are home to many endangered species. These grasslands are home to 75% of Alberta's species at risk. The ferruginous hawk is North America's largest hawk and a breeding pair during the nesting season can catch almost 500 small mammals. This species has been labelled as threatened due to habitat loss and declining food sources. Alberta's grasslands are a vital ecosystem that supports biodiversity, Stores carbon and provides a unique environment for species at risk. Despite their importance these landscapes continue to shrink. They truly hold so much more than just grass.

Invasive Species Highlight

Leafy Spurge- *Eurphobia esula*

Leafy spurge was introduced into Canada as an ornamental or as crop seed contamination from Asia and Europe. This perennial is a noxious weed that must be controlled in Alberta. It has a hairless stem with long, narrow leaves that alternate or spiral. The stem contains milky latex. Flowers are small, yellow-green and look like 2 hearts connected.

Like the look of leafy spurge but not the damage? Many garden centers carry a domesticated type of spurge called cushion spurge (Euphorbia polychrome). Make sure to check the scientific name before purchasing.



Clean, Drain Dry!!!

From paddle board to boat, anyone transporting watercraft entering the east or south borders must report to a watercraft inspection station. If the nearest station is closed, an inspection must happen within 7 days or before launching into Alberta's waters. Under the Fisheries (Alberta) Act, fines have increased. Bypassing an inspection station that is open while transporting a watercraft can result in a \$4,200 fine. Failure to pull the plug may result in a \$600 fine. Roadside Spraying and Brush Mowing

Throughout the County, you will see the spray trucks and mowers are out and about. This helps to increase visibility on roadways, reduce snow drift and aids in controlling weeds. When sharing the road, please slow down, be patient and ensure to pass when safe. Please keep ditches clear of debris.
